PRESIDENTS ADDRESS



Hello all and welcome to another edition of Focal Plane.

The last two months have been action packed on all fronts with good attendance at workshops, competitions and field events. We are also seeing a larger number of prints and digital images than

ever before being submitted, prompting the committee to rethink some aspects of our nights in addition to finding a larger venue.

To that end I can say by the time you read this Focal Plane we hope to be ensconced at St Pauls Church (St Vincent Ave, Remuera) from August onwards. St Pauls has room for us to grow without the current cramped conditions we have today and I believe will allow us to run our nights more efficiently. We will need to make some improvements to the hall to cater for our needs and we will be putting a call out soon for folk with handyman & curtain expertise.

Another change to try and improve the flow of our nights is members need to register their prints via email to the Print Convenor by the Sunday before the competition night. This enables the majority of the paperwork to be completed well and truly before the night and is hoped to allow us to start on time.

Some of you have asked about what my vision is for APS. It is simple...

- 1: ensure you have fun taking and presenting your imagery.
- 2: create opportunities to take images, explore your photographic journey, and mechanisms to present them.
- 3: ensure the infrastructure of APS is strong enough to cater for members to take images and present them, today and in the future.

At the last AGM I talked about the two main components of the Club – the Workshops & Competition nights – and about the third component that we wanted to bolster – that of the social side where I would suggest is one of the best ways to share knowledge and experiences.

The first part of bolstering the social fabric of APS is the position of Field Event Coordinator and we have had some excellent events take place recently with at least one more before the end of the year.

The second part of bolstering the social side of the club is the recent formation of evening forum groups (for want of a better phrase) where members can discuss photography in general. It is excellent to see this happening and I hope more of you take these opportunities up.

I have received some comment and indeed I am concerned with the large number of honours images being awarded during the course of the competition nights. Obviously there are more images being presented each night, but when 40% of them gain honours this seems excessive. In the past around 10% of images may gain honours or in some cases none at all. Traditionally honours club images infer it could gain at least an acceptance at PSNZ or even NZIPP level. To that end I have asked the judges to be much stronger in not handing out honours – you are just going to have to work harder!

For those who may be concerned this will impact your journey through the grades – do not be – APS grading only partially relies on points awarded over the course of the year.

Recently, some committee members and I attended a Regional Committee get-together which was an excellent chance to meet our counterparts, discuss ideas, problems and resolutions. It was also an opportunity to sound out ideas for the 2010 regional convention that APS will host next year. I hope also to have more weekend shoots with our counterpart clubs, much like the recent Waiheke events.

Well enough from me. Enjoy your year and get out there with your camera in hand!

FASHION SHOOT WINS SUPPORT FROM THE FASHION INDUSTRY.

The APS fashion course is now well underway. Amanda Bangrove of Catwalk Studios giving the opening address. Three practice sessions are now scheduled before Michael Ng, world ranking fashion photographer, makes a presentation on studio lighting.

The course is aimed at increasing the awareness of Fashion Photography, with six key presentations by industry leaders, and practical sessions in between. It involves over 40 people including Models, Make Up Artists, Stylists and other professionals.



The course is part of a series of courses being undertaken to give members the opportunity to develop skills in different areas of photography. Other courses are planned on "Still Life Studio Lighting". "Portrait studio Lighting". Details are on the club website under Field Events.

The Fashion course consists of a general overview of model training and the types of photos required in the fashion industry. There are presentations by leading

photographers and several agency presentations and a full on fashion shoot.

The course is being supported by Catwalk Studios, August Talent, Michael Ng Photography, Clyne Management, Apix Photographic Supplies, Trelise Cooper, Liz Mitchell and many others.

SALON_OPEN_JaneDoe_NOTITLE.jpg
